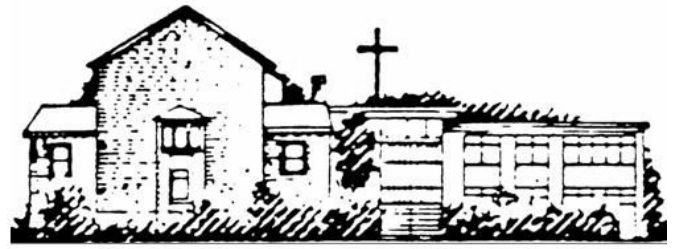

JULY MUSINGS

Thanks to all who participated in our "congregational timeline" event in preparation for the Summer Collegium on small church leadership. Part of that assignment was for me to bring a written reflection of my learnings from that timeline event. Excerpts include:

I learned that St. Paul's has changed from being a missionary congregation (one receiving mission until 1945 from the German Evangelical Synod and later the Evangelical and Reformed denomination) to one of offering mission. A deeper shift seems to have begun in the mid-1980's with the addition of some particular mission projects (like the Family and Adult Service Center) that are still part of St. Paul's life and story. In addition to the late 1970's invitation to the 12-Step recovery groups to meet in the building, once a month the church has cooked and served lunch for up to 100 persons who are homeless at a downtown day shelter for 24 consecutive years. For the past five years there have been monthly pancake breakfasts (initially conceived as fund-raisers) which have evolved into neighborhood connection and mission – with donations accepted but not required.

And with the creation of an ecumenical graduate school of religion at Seattle University, St. Paul's has become a "teaching parish" with two seminary interns with field education placements and a third to begin this fall. Two members from within the congregation have heard a call to ministry in recent years, gone on to graduate school, been (or very soon will be) ordained at St. Paul's, and are serving other United Church of Christ congregations. We are a "teaching and serving parish" – with an intentional progressive identity in a thriving urban neighborhood, and seeking to be visible in a city that often sees "church" as past tense.

This exercise has reaffirmed how grateful I am to be in a place so faithful and vital! Hopefully David and I will return with more insight and fresh perspective. And, as ever, more will be revealed by the Holy Spirit in her own good time.

Variations on Walking Programs

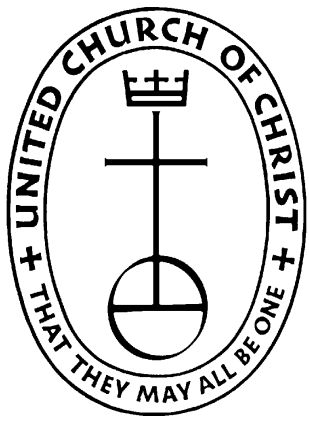

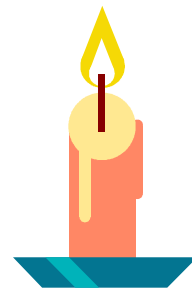

Meeting called to order. Visitors introduced. Check in. April minutes were reviewed and accepted. – M/S/P

Deanna Murray, Pastor, Prospect Congregational UCC

Prospect Congregational UCC is exploring a new governance structure and is seeking out and visiting other churches who have gone through similar transitions. She asked to sit in on our council meeting as an observer. Welcome Deanna!

Green Coffee Hour

Connie Voget proposed a Green Coffee Hour in conjunction with 10/10/10, an event put on by www.350.org, an environmental group. The weekend of October 10, 2010, groups are encouraged to explore small steps that can reduce their carbon footprint. Connie proposes that we devote our coffee hour on October 10 to low-carbon eating. In cooperation with a 'green' guest cook, low-impact food would be offered along with literature describing how these choices positively impact the environment. Emphasis would also be put on recycling and composting. A group Connie is active in is reading *Food and Faith*, which talks about our relationship to food and the earth in a spiritual context, and *Diet for a Hot Planet*, which discusses the impact that our current eating habits have on climate change. Connie also suggested a showing of the film *Peaceable Kingdom*, which talks about the need for elimination of factory farming.

It was noted that the trees St. Paul's will receive from the Seattle City arborist to be planted in the grass strips next to the parking lot, and new recycling bins acquired by Anne Lewis, might be celebrated in conjunction with Green Coffee Hour.

Pastor's Report

Tim distributed an article about homeless people who live in their vehicles in the Ballard area, and the efforts of a group to create space in Ballard church parking lots for these individuals as a 'safe harbor.' There are three suggested levels of car camping programs, the most basic of which St. Paul's already performs (allowing up to two vehicles in lot). **Action item:** Council to read article for discussion next month. There was discussion about the Sunday schedule for the next few months, including Tim and David's absence, Mick's departure, guest preachers and substitute musicians, Jason Boyd's ordination, annual retreat, and *Small, Strong Congregations*.

Committee Reports

Church School Committee Report (Jan)

Sharon James reports that church school is on hiatus with an absence of school-aged children, but that may change with the current cohort of preschoolers entering school in a couple of years.

House Committee Report (Kathy)

Ed Philyaw expressed appreciation for Fred Hoy, who has gone 'above and beyond' in his service of painting the lobby and library; and for Fred Godfrey, who regularly checks and maintains the building roof. Ed has some suggestions for other projects, pending availability of funds (downstairs blinds, water damage on beam in Foster Hall, painting sanctuary, replacing external door to library, nursery carpeting, exterior lights). There was discussion of moving to a vinyl or carpet-tile floor for ease of cleanup and for environmental-sensitivity reasons.

New business

Electrical Audit

Tim read an article from a recent newsletter from the UCC insurance board about an electrical inspection service for \$225 by an independent, licensed electrician. For utilizing this service, the church would receive \$500 credit toward anything that is deemed 'critical' or 'severely needed.' Motion to use Building Reserve funds. – M/S/P

Music Director Search Committee Report

Kathy reported that part of the search is to explore where we are going with our music ministry. Tim will explore the topic further at the summer collegium and upon further discussion with the council and committee, the ad will be posted later in the summer.

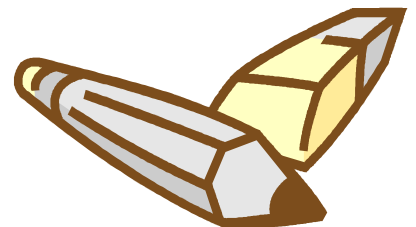
Next Meeting
